For example, the number of students who plan only to attend school (e.g., they do not plan to work or join the military and do not have other plans) is given as "School." Those who intend to attend school and work are counted as "School and Work."

Note. 1) "No response" indicates students who did not respond to any of the post high school plan choices. The number of surveys returned is the denominator used to calculate the "No response" percent. 2) The percents in this table are based upon the the number of surveys returned minus the "No response" figure.
